In addition to Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA), families assigned to Naples on military and government orders have the following school choice options: homeschooling, international schools, private schools and Italian public schools. *Costs associated with choices other than DoDEA are not reimbursable. <h3>Homeschool Options</h3> <p>What is homeschooling? Homeschooling is the practice of opting to teach one's own children at home via parents, tutors, or virtual programs instead of (or in lieu of) sending them to school.</p> <p>Do I have to register somewhere? Children of US military and DoD military personnel overseas are not subject to US state mandatory attendance statutes while in another country. Children of US military and DoD military personnel overseas are not subject to the school laws in Italy. DoDEA does not require families register with them, but registering as a homeschooler with DoDEA is an option.</p> <p>Can I receive any financial assistance? No financial support is available through the Non-DoD Schools Program (NSDP) for school choices other than the DoDEA schools or the Support Site.</p> <p>How much does homeschooling cost? \$10 to \$100 per month per student. Cheapest approach (\$100-200). Consider finding services for free or reducing your services with assistance sites. Moderate approach (\$300-500). Includes a few paid extras like on-camp, tutors, online courses, or extracurricular classes like art or music. Most expensive approach (\$1000+). Includes paying for tutors, online classes, tutors courses, correspondence schools, or all-inclusive curriculum packages. Budget-friendly ways to reduce your contribution. Borrow or rent. Library (low-cost, sales, reusable or multi-level options). Maria Maddalena, 100 80138 Naples, Italy 081-481-1211 www.aishofnaples.it</p>	<h3>Italian Public School Options</h3> <p>About</p> <p>There are four levels of education in Italy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scuola dell'infanzia or Scuola materna (5 to 13 years old) • Scuola primaria or Scuola elementare (6 to 11 years old) • Scuola secondaria di primo grado or Scuola media (11 to 14 years old) • Scuola secondaria di secondo grado or Scuola superiore (14 to 19 years old) <p>Cost</p> <p>State schools are free, even for foreigners living in Italy who are not formal permanent residents. Fees may apply for registration. Books are required and may need to be purchased by the family depending on the educational level. Expenditure taxes do become applicable after students reach the age of 16.</p> <p>Language</p> <p>State-sponsored schools teach in Italian. English is usually taught as a second language.</p> <p>Lunch</p> <p>Menus in school lunch. Families will need to purchase vouchers (tickets) in person or online (depending on the voucher used) for the district. Families may need to purchase plates and utensils. Families may be provided plates and utensils that need to be cleaned and returned every day. Providing a personal learning lunch for your student is typically required.</p>

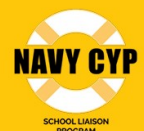
